

A.C.E. Center receives donation

The Acceptance, Change, Empowerment (A.C.E.) Center in Seaford, a component of FHR (Fellowship Health Resources, Inc.), has received four new computers and two printers that will be used to combat unemployment thanks to philanthropic support.

The A.C.E. Center in Seaford is making dramatic headway in providing career resources to its community members. The center also offers health, wellness and arts programs to those in recovery from mental health illness and/or substance abuse.

The new equipment was awarded by Shared Network Access Point (SNAP), a program of the Delaware Workforce Investment Board (DWIB), in partnership with the Delaware Department of Labor.

Jim Martin, an FHR peer specialist with a background in human resources, saw this vocational program as a pivotal opportunity for the A.C.E. Center and the Delaware community at large. "I know the job search process and how dedicated you have to be to find employment. If you are serious, securing a position can be a full-time job in itself. The A.C.E. Center is known as a center for resources, and what better resource to offer the community than services to help in their job search."

The new computer equipment will enable community members to connect to an extensive array of job resources, including Delaware's Job Link. In addition, the center will use peer-to-peer mentoring, allowing peers who have been successful in securing a position and launching their careers to help other peers navigate the beginning of their own job search.
